As we were not able to hold our annual Fun Day in the Catoctin Mountains, we are forgoing our Fall Match and will instead host a Fun Day on September 9, 2023, in Walkersville, MD. The flyer is included in this newsletter. We hope that all our Berner Community will join us. There have been quite a few developments impacting our Independent Specialty to be held in October at the Howard County Fairgrounds.

We were advised by the Mount Vernon Dog Training Club (MVDTC) that holds AKC approval for that weekend that they will not give us permission to hold our events this year. As we cannot hold Rally/Obedience as part of our Specialty, as a measure of support for our performance club members, we will support the MVDTC BMD entries the weekend of Oct 27-29, 2023, at the event held in Point of Rocks, MD. We will also look to see if we can hold a separate Rally/OB event in 2024.

The Board held a special meeting to determine if we wanted to move forward with the Independent Specialty this year as our Specialty in 2022 was not well attended. We had a negative balance of almost \$4k in 2022. We discussed whether holding an Independent Specialty was in the best interest of all our members. The Board voted to hold this year's Specialty and to keep expenses to a minimum.

PVBMDC is once again offering an exciting September program for Draft teams here in the Maryland Catoctin Mountains.

On **September 10** we will conduct a **Draft Workshop** at Hearts Delight in Smithsburg, MD, for learning and sharpening your carting skills.

For Novice and more experienced teams: the ring will be set for maneuvering practice and dry runs with an instructor/ judge, along with freight haul practice over the network of paths used in our Draft Tests.

For Beginners: we will hold a Beginners Workshop with a step-by-step hands-on training method with Jack Crifasi. This training program has been presented many times at our annual PV workshop and at BMDCA National Specialties. It will help teams get off to a good safe start with their beginning dogs. All Berner-sized equipment is provided, or bring your own for proper setup. Send in the Pre-registration form or register at the site. Starting time is 9AM Sunday Sept 10. Flyer/registration is attached.

On **September 16 and 17** we will hold our annual **Draft Tests with judges Larry Bohlig and Sue Van Ocker** at the same site as the workshop. The premium is out and attached, and needs to be submitted before the Sept 6 closing, coming soon!

Site: Hearts Delight Farm, 4050 Garfield Road, Smithsburg, MD 21783

Site located in Catoctin Mountains west of Thurmont, MD

Workshop 9 am to 2 pm - Bring a bag lunch - drinks are provided

Use the workshop to practice for the September 16 and 17 PVBMDC draft tests at the same location!

Workshop Description: Beginner, novice and experienced dog teams are welcome! Open to any breed able to pull a cart! Please don't bring bitches in heat to the site! All dogs must be crated or on leash at all times except during off-lead drafting exercises.

Beginners: All dogs should have some basic control training on leash but no draft experience is required. 4 to 6 foot leash is suggested, with regular collars. Harnesses and training equipment are provided for a range of BMD-sized dogs, or bring your own. An experienced instructor will lead the workshop, introducing teams to basic skills required for drafting, with hands-on training using drag bars, sleds and carts, and guidance for further at-home training. Dogs must be in fit condition and over 8 months old. Safety and positive training are essential, so bring plenty of food treats for rewards!

Novice and Open teams: Practice commands and handling techniques for participation in a BMDCA draft test. A draft ring and freight haul will be set up, with mock judging and handling hints by an instructor.

Spring Dog Walk

The April Meet-up at Black Hill Regional Park was abruptly canceled due to last minute notice the park was closed for a private event. This was a disappointment as it is a particularly desirable park, but we will return next year.

Great Falls Park, VA hosted it's first annual B.A.R.K. Ranger event including a parade to kick off National Park Week. Registration was required, but admission to the park was free. A few club members and their Berners were able to join in with other dogs for a nice walk. The Rangers refer to our group as the Berner Brigade, and expect to hold additional events throughout the year. They will post to their Facebook page.

The PVBMDC Spring Dog Walk returned to Western Regional Park. MD. We welcomed 10 Berners and their families. Berners ranged in age from 6mos. - 8 y.o. The weather was Berner approved, 68 degrees, with sprinkles to gentle rain. We went for a nice walk through the hilly forested and ravine trails, and around the soccer fields. Thank you to Blair who brought along homemade, healthy pupcakes to share with the Berners to celebrate Blueberry's 3rd birthday! This was well received by all. Everyone enjoyed the chance to visit and learn from one another. The park is easily accessible with free parking, and there was plenty of space for all. Pavilions are not available for rent on weekends this time of year, but are first come first served. We will continue to revisit this park.

Extending a big thank you to HANK and my husband Gus, who generously give of their time to visit each park in advance to walk and curate the trails, determining if they are suitable and worthy of the Berner seal of approval.

The Berner families continue to be very appreciative of these Meet-up opportunities. They hear about these activities predominantly through Facebook, the PV website, other Berner families, and attendance at prior PV events. We now will take a break for the summer and return to the Fall Dog Walk at Great Falls Park, VA to kick-off prime Berner season in October 2023, with Meet-ups resuming November 2023 through April 2024, and the Spring Dog Walk in May 2024.

PVBMDC Rescue Update

Thank you to Mary McKnight who has been our PVBMD Rescue Chair since 2016. Her dedication to our Berners needing rescue or rehoming has been heroic. Taking on this effort is bittersweet; joy-filled when you find the perfect new home and sad because it is needed. If anyone would like to provide asistance please contact me.

In the past, PVBMD has typically rehomed or rescued an average of three Berners a year. Since taking over a month ago there has been 6 Berners in need. Most of these Berners are surrendered because of t wo reasons, 1) owners declining health or 2) behavior or temperament issues.

The first case involved a 4 year-old male Berner. The owner was no longer able to take care of Buster because of declining health. Working with the owner's sister I soon realized that this was a case of mistaken identity. The 130 pound Berner was actually a Greater Swiss Mountain Dog. Contacting the GSMD National Club we were able to refer him to the appropriate rehome services

Darby a 3 year-old female Berner was intended for a Bernerdoodle operation. Even though she had a limited AKC registration she was breed unsuccessfully twice. Working with her owner, Darby was successfully place with an experienced Berner family. Today, she is enjoying her new family and sister Coco. Oakley a 9 month male Berner was food aggressive with his multi-breed pack of 6. Working with his foster family we found an experienced Berner family that will provide the training and one on one attention he greatly needs.

Maverick a 4 year old male Berner found in an abandoned apartment was transferred to the WV Parkersburg Humane Society Shelter. He was adopted out and then returned due to food and dog aggression. An outside rescue organization rapidly acquired him with a foster family and hopefully a future placement. Maverick can be found on Roscoe's Rescues.

These are some of the recent rescue/rehome cases. Most of these situations can be avoided with proper training and family emergency planning. If something happens to you what will happen to your beloved companion? Plan accordingly.

Memorial

After Brett's recent cancer scare, and recovery from surgery, he was the one I was closely monitoring. Bogie was developing some arthritis, but was otherwise fine - or so I thought. The last thing I expected was to come home from work on his 8th birthday to find him sick and miserable. After discussions with the emergency clinic - who could not get him in for hours, and with a veterinarian friend, he seemed to be resting comfortably, so we decided to monitor him at home until morning - when he could go to his regular vet. They had no open appointments, so I dropped him off on my way to work - with a kiss on the top of his head, I told him I loved him and promised to come back and get him.

The blood work was not good. X-rays revealed an abdominal mass. He was not a surgical candidate. Shortly after the tests were completed, Bogie crashed. Uncontrollable vomiting and now in extreme pain. The vet sedated him and called me to come in as quickly as possible to say goodbye. Never crazy about strangers, Bogie trusted me implicitly to keep him safe. Heavily sedated, it broke my heart to think that he probably had no idea that I was even there — or that I had kept my promise to come back. I hugged him as best I could, held his big, floppy paws, and kissed his soft muzzle. I thanked him for the gift of his love and trust. I told him to go find his half brother Merlin, who would comfort him and keep him from being afraid without me. I told him I'd see him again one day - and I let him go.

My big, shy, teddy bear love bug was gone. Never again would I see his eyes light up, or watch him dance around, when he knew it was time to go to dog school. He would excitedly jump into the car, but only with his front end. For his whole life, it was my job to pick up his back end and "help" him the rest of the way in. Never again would I laugh as he flopped over on his side to "play dead" (with his tail wagging the whole time) - a trick he somehow taught himself. Never again would he come in from outside with a big string of drool across the top of his muzzle - or frozen to the top of his head if it was cold outside. You were a handsome gentleman, but also a clown. I'll never forget you Boge Man!
